Sub:- Application dated 29.08.2018 of the **President, Rajeev Education Trust, Hassan-573201, Karnataka** to establish a new Ayurveda Medical College in the name of “**Rajeev Institute of Ayurvedic Medical Science and Research Centre Hassan-573201, Karnataka**” with **60 seats in UG (BAMS) course**, under Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 from the academic session 2019-20 – **Permission Letter -reg.**

Sir,

I am directed to refer to your application dated 29.08.2018 on the subject cited above, which was forwarded to the CCIM vide Ministry's letter of even no. dated 18.12.2018 for necessary action as per the provision of IMCC act, 1970 and relevant regulations.

2. Accordingly, the CCIM had visited the college on 06.02.2019 and issued Letter of Intent to you vide letter No. 4-170/2019-Ay (NP) dated 12.04.2019 to establish a new Ayurveda college in the name of “**Rajeev Institute of Ayurvedic Medical Science and Research Centre Hassan-573201, Karnataka**” with **60 seats in UG (BAMS) course** from the academic session 2019-20 under section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970.

3. The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution again on 23-24.05.2019 to assess the available facilities of teaching and practical training for conducting UG (BAMS) course and to verify the compliance of shortcomings informed by the CCIM under section 13A of IMCC Act, 1970 and forwarded its recommendations and report to the Ministry. On examining the same in terms of Regulation 3 and 10 of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016”, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs), it is found that the College is fulfilling notified and approved criterion for issuing **Letter of Permission** for conducting UG (BAMS) course from the academic session 2019-20.

4. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to **issue Letter of Permission to President, Rajeev Education Trust, Hassan-573201, Karnataka** to establish a new Ayurveda Medical College in the name of **“Rajeev Institute of Ayurvedic Medical Science and Research Centre Hassan-573201, Karnataka”** with **60 seats in UG (BAMS) course** from the academic session 2019-20 under section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, subject to following conditions:

- i. The college shall submit an undertaking in form of affidavit duly notarized within one month from the date of issue of the letter, explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- ii. The colleges shall submit undertaking in the form of Affidavit duly notarized to get permanent registration of the Teachers/Hospital Clinical Staff/Consultant in concerned State Boards/Council where the college/hospital is located or Central Registration of the CCIM by 31st December, 2019 as per the decisions conveyed vide letters 22.03.2019 & 22.04.2019 by CCIM and decided by the High Court of Delhi in W.P. No. 2369 of 2019, which will be verified by the Council during next visitation while considering the matter for grant/denial of permission for the academic year 2020-21.

5. It is further informed that 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 UG seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quotas shall be conducted by the Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State. If any seats are not filled up in the Central Counseling, the same shall be transferred to the said Counseling Authority to admit students as per their rules/ reservation policies/norms. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the Central counseling for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

6. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made thereunder.

7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of CCIM and the Central Government.

8. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2019 to get permission for the session 2020-21:

- (i) all the Requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 and 10 of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda); and
- (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*

9. The college administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the relevant CCIM Regulations, are in position before the admission of the first batch of students in the 1st professional of BAMS course is made, under intimation to the Central Government and CCIM.

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10. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for IInd, IIIrd and IVth professionals well in time as per the CCIM norms which will be verified and reported by the CCIM at least three months before the start of next professional and accordingly, the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be issued.

11. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 14(2) of the IMCC Act, 1970 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.

12. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to CCIM under intimation to this Ministry. The CCIM will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled by means of an inspection and submit a report along with its assessment in this matter to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2020-21.
